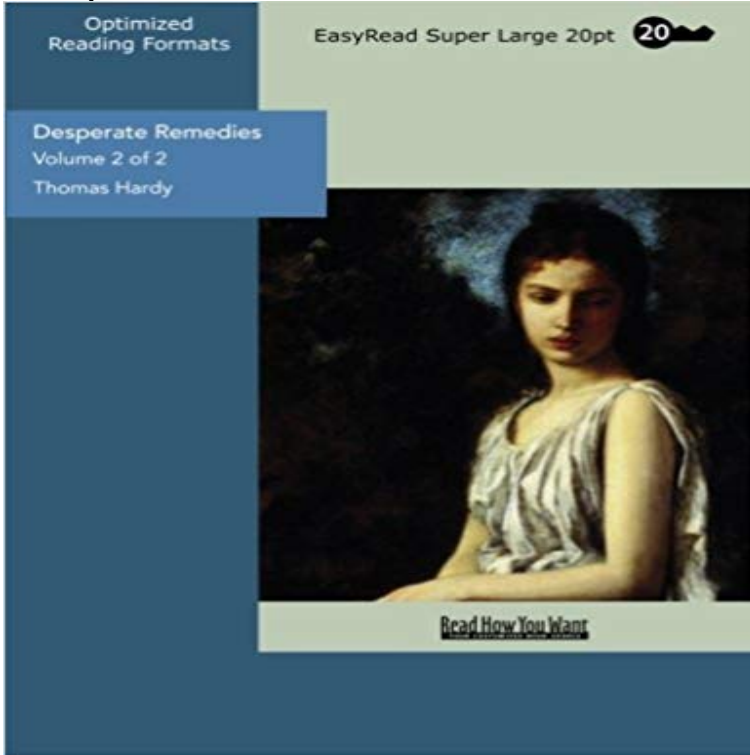


Desperate Remedies
